


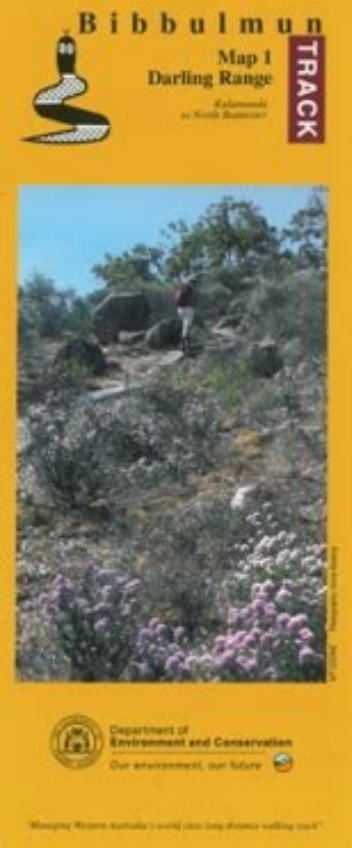

Moreover, if you willingly quit your job, are an independent contractor or otherwise self-employed, or can't go back to work for health or other reasons, you might not qualify. MORE FROM QUESTIONSANSWERED.NET Nearly all unemployment agencies accept claims online, especially in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. AirportTerminalMaps is one example of this type of site. Consider parking options, shuttles and driving time to plan your trip. The bigger the airport, the bigger the confusion. This depends on the source and the airport, but navigating online can lead you to a lot of other helpful information. Depending on the state you reside in, you will be eligible to apply for unemployment benefits online, in person, on the phone or by mailing in a claim form. If you fail to answer the questions correctly — or don't consent to this process — you will most likely be asked to provide the agency with documents that verify your identity.Step 4: File Your ClaimOnce you confirm your eligibility, it's time to file your claim. Locate food courts, floor plans, gates, security checkpoints, lounges and baggage claim. You'll be directed to terminal maps, street maps and driving directions. Long story short, where you're currently residing might not be the state that will pay you unemployment benefits if you haven't lived there long. Several states conduct telephone interviews before the final ruling to help prevent potential unemployment insurance fraud. The state agency will provide guidance on that as well as any other issues that could impact your claim.Step 2: Determine Your EligibilityAs stated earlier, you need to meet certain criteria in order to be eligible for unemployment benefits. Details include finding things like restaurants, stores and terminal maps. The online process isn't just helpful for pandemic safety reasons. Look for departures, arrivals and lists of airlines. Although this rule may vary by state at times due to special circumstances (like a global pandemic), the general rule of thumb is that you're expected to pursue work leads every week and report your work search efforts in your weekly claim.Do you have COVID-19-specific questions about unemployment benefits and stimulus checks? It depends on the reason you were fired, and the rules vary by state. By the end of April, a staggering 30 million Americans had filed for unemployment benefits. Without a doubt, the ongoing pandemic throws a bit of a wrench into the process of actively seeking work, so that component may vary from state to state and could change at any time. Here's how to find maps that help.Airport DirectoriesAirport directories are found inside airport terminals and online on many airport websites. Additionally, if your application is denied for any reason, you have the right to file an appeal to try to overturn the denial.Step 3: Verify Your IdentityDuring the initial application process, each state's unemployment division will ask you to verify and authenticate your identity. If you lost your job due to the pandemic or other reasons, here are the steps to take next to file an unemployment claim online.Step 1: Contact Your State Unemployment AgencyWhether you were laid off because of the pandemic or lost your job due to other unforeseen circumstances, filing for unemployment benefits is one way to cover a portion of your monthly bills while you're between jobs. To qualify for unemployment, an individual who lost their job must be eligible for work, able to work and actively seeking employment. If you have a device running an Android operating system, open the Google Maps app for similar results. A street view feature allows you to get a look from the sky to help ground yourself with where you are in relation to the terminal. These types of requests are typically very time sensitive. Since those early days of chaos, most states have adapted and made improvements to handle all the claims. If you need to double-check once you're there, you can find the directory inside.Device Map AppsApple Maps is an app that helps with viewing the layout of an airport terminal. Map out how to enter the airport for the closest location to your gate and security checkpoints. Download the app to your iOS mobile device to begin using it. Look for sites that help you stay informed about airport services with shuttles, cabs, buses and trains for transportation. These steps may take place as you're filing your application, or they could be the last steps in determining your eligibility. If you fail to file your weekly claim, your benefits may be delayed or stopped altogether. You can find restaurants and reviews to see what patrons have to say about their dining experiences inside the airport. While you may be breathing an initial sigh of relief once your initial claim is processed, be sure to maintain your eligibility status by continuing your job search as directed.Step 6: File Your Weekly Payment Request and Keep Up the Job SearchOnce you start receiving unemployment benefits, you have to file weekly or biweekly (varies by state) payment requests online to be paid — no exceptions. Both are big airports, so looking online ahead of time can save you time and may increase your chances of getting through the terminals faster. Finally, keep in mind that unemployment benefits are taxable, so it's generally wise to choose to have taxes withheld from each payment when you first open your claim.Step 5: Collect Your Unemployment BenefitsMost claims are processed within two to three calendar weeks or 10 business days, although delays could occur during times of high claim volumes. Virtual systems also reduce errors and speed up the claim process. Photo Courtesy: SDI Productions/E+/Getty Images When you file your claim, you will be asked for some personal information, including your name, address(es), social security number (SSN), last 18 months of employment history, a record of wages earned and the reason and dates for your employment termination. Quickly locate the nearest coffee shop or souvenir store. You'll be required to answer some questions about any work you completed each week as well as any other income you received. Set up email notifications, if possible, and watch closely for any messages requesting additional information. If you have any difficulty locating your local center, contact your state unemployment agency for assistance. In some cases, people who were fired, suspended or asked to take a leave of absence don't qualify for unemployment. In most cases, you will file a claim with the state where you most recently worked, but if you recently relocated from another state, that may not be the case. Even worse, months later, many jobless people were still desperately trying to cut through all the red tape and the massive volume of people to file their own unemployment claims. Our peers over at Ask.com have the answers. Texas, for example, waived their work search requirement for many months but reinstated it on November 1. Once you have your bearings, you can proceed with your travel plans.Additional LinksAs you use mapping resources, you may come across additional links for information. Parking details can show you on- and off-site availability along with hotels that provide shuttle services to and from the airport.
